Students and parents* should EACH bring the following:

- **FSA ID** (please sign up and bring both your **Student FSA ID** and **Parent FSA ID***, available at fsaid.ed.gov)
- Social Security Number
- Driver's License number
- federal tax return
- W-2 or year-end pay stub
- untaxed income records
- business and investment records
- Bank statement(s)
- Alien Registration Card (if not a U.S. Citizen)
